- 2) Their faith is sure sinne to endure, grounded on Christ, the corner stone: Moved wich none ill, but standeth still, stedfull like to Mount Sion.
- 3) And as about Jerusalem, the lmightie hills do it compasst, So that no enemies come to them to hirt the tome in any case,
- 4) So God in deed in every neede, his faithful people doth defend: Standing them by assurelly, from time forth world without end.
- 5) Right wise and good is our Lord God, and will not suffer certainely: The sinners and ungodles rod, to tarry upon his family.
